Fort McIntosh Garrison, First Company

The modern-day First Company, Fort McIntosh Garrison, was formed in 1981 to honor Beaver's role in the Revolutionary War. Fort McIntosh was the first permanent post of the U.S. Army — known as the First Post of the First American Regiment. The Garrison keeps this history alive through battle reenactments, parades, lectures, and living history encampments.

The unit consists of living history re-enactors — men, women, and children — and welcomes participation from the whole family. Demonstrations of 18th-century crafts such as campfire cooking, spinning, and candle dipping help educate the public about life during the era. Members wear accurate military uniforms, civilian dress, and even represent Native American allies of the time.

An affiliate of the Beaver Area Heritage Foundation, the Garrison plays an important role in preserving and sharing the region's early American history.

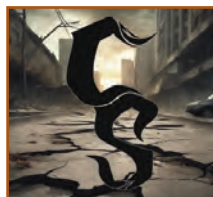

Old Fashioned Buckwheat Cake

1/2 pkg. dry yeast or cake
1/2 cup warm water (dissolve & add)
1 tsp. salt
1-1/2 cup(s) buckwheat flour

Milk to mix fairly thick. Leave set overnight in room 35° to 50° Place in a container of 2 qt. size or larger. May be kept in refrigerator. In morning, to active, dissolve 1/4 tsp. baking soda, 1/4 cup boiling water. Add to starter and thin with more milk to desired thickness. Fry on well-greased pan — There must be 3/4-1 cup of starter left to add to for the following days. If wanted — double the starter at the beginning.

Spoon Bread

1 cup corn meal
1/4 cup cold water
1/2 cup boiling water
2/3 tsp. salt
1 tbsp. butter
1 tsp. baking powder
1 or 2 eggs beaten lightly
3/4 cup milk

Mix corn meal with cold water. Add boiling water. Stir over fire until consistency of very thick mush. Add butter and salt. Cool. Then mix baking powder with egg. Stir well. Pour into greased pan about 2-1/2" thick Bake 40-45 minutes at 350° until firm. Serve at once.



Corn Meal Muffins

3/4 cup sugar
1 egg
pinch of salt
3 tsp. baking powder
1 tbsp. melted butter
3/4 cup corn meal
1 cup water

Mix all ingredients together. Makes 12 muffins. Bake 20-25 minutes in moderate oven 350-375°.

Corn Meal Griddle Cakes

2 cups buttermilk
2 egg yolks
1-1/2 tsp. salt
2 tbsp. shortening
1 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. soda
1 cup cornmeal
1 cup white flour
2 egg whites

Sift flour, measure and add soda, baking powder, and salt. Sift again. Beat yolks and add buttermilk and dry ingredients. Beat and add melted butter. Stir in stiffly beaten egg whites. Bake on hot griddle. Turn once only. Serve with syrup. (Makes about 8 medium cakes)

Banana Whole Wheat Bread

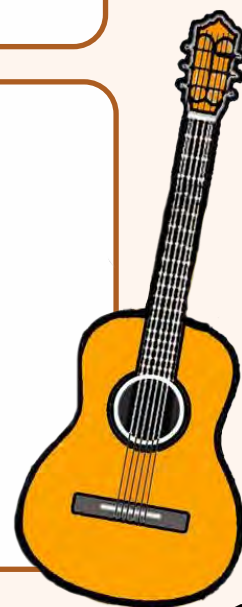
1-1/2 cup white flour
2 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
1 cup whole wheat flour
1 cup mashed bananas
1/4 cup water or buttermilk
1/4 cup shortening
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 egg slightly beaten

Sift flour, measure: add baking powder, soda and salt. Sift again and add whole wheat flour. Mix well. Combine bananas, water or buttermilk. Cream shortening. Add sugar. Beat until light and fluffy. Add egg and mix until smooth. Add dry ingredients alternately with banana mixture, stirring just enough to combine. Do not beat. Turn into greased loaf pan and bake in a moderate oven 250° for 45-50 minutes.

Johnny Cake

1 cup bread or pastry flour
1 cup fine corn meal
3/4 cup brown sugar
1 tsp. salt
3/8 tsp. soda
1 egg beaten
1/2 cup sour or buttermilk
1/3 cup sour cream

Sift dry ingredients together. Add beaten egg, sour milk, and cream. Mix thoroughly, put in greased cake pan or muffin pans and bake 20 minutes at 450°.
